

Dyckerhoff Reuilly 2012 in Hachette 2014

Coup de Coeur



Christian Dyckerhoff discovered his vocation as a wine-grower in Alsace, one shared by his wife Benedicte, who was born into an Alsatian wine-growing family. Their Reuilly blanc, from three hectares of Sauvignon planted on Kimmeridgian soils, really won the hearts of the tasting panel.

This cuvee exudes freshness: citrus, a hint of sea-spray, notes of flowers and summer preserves all lend it great finesse. The supple and ample palate echoes the aromas with sweet-tart fresh fruit and blood orange, with a touch of meringue on the finish. Exceptionally elegant, this wine would be a beautiful match for seared scallops.
